Message from the President

A very warm welcome and all good wishes to you all for 2010!

I know our holiday season had long passed and the promise of a prosperous New Year already started with loads of 'hard' objectives to focus on for ICSD this year.

I am pleased to report that we had our first ICSD Executive Committee (EC) meeting last month and we discussed various issues which obviously will determine and shape the organisation in more ways than one.

Firstly the EC (name now changed to 'Board') has produced final draft of the ICSD Strategic Plan which will help to steer the ICSD in the right direction by courtesy of agreed strategic objectives for the next three years. We have also set great aspirations and goals for the future so this document will be available to the member nations around March/April this year.

Secondly, the Board has also agreed to search for 5th member-at-large to complete the governance so hopefully these will be accomplished sometime this year.

The ICSD Office have worked so hard to produce an excellent list of new and updated handbooks which helped to consolidate the structure, guidelines, regulations and procedures and to guide the way forward for the revised and new constitution and bylaws of ICSD.

We were fortunate enough to follow a number of IOC requirements and first of which is the implementation of WADA code which includes:

- ICSD Office has updated Anti-doping rules & regulations to include WADA 2009 model (awaiting WADA approval)
- ICSD to implement ADAMS and instructions are soon to be available on website
- Soon to be announced selection of IRTP (International Registered Testing Pool)
- Revised and updated TUE forms soon to be on website
- Cooperation with NADO (National Anti-doping Organisation)
- Sanctions & Control Administrator was appointed in December 2009 to focus on WADA

Second of IOC requirements – to set up a new Memorandum of Understanding with IOC – so as to ensure the name of 'Deaflympics' is protected under the rights of the Olympic partners. However this does mean that we will have to consider new entity for the organisation in the very near future. I believe this is going to be extremely crucial if not a positive move for ICSD as this will open more doors of opportunities from marketing, media and sponsorship context.

Third of IOC requirements is to communicate IOC recommendations from 'The Olympic Movement in Society' a document which was approved at the last IOC Congress in Copenhagen in October 2009. 13 aspects of the report's contents written by Dr. Donald Ammons have been of great significance for ICSD as a whole. This will figure as part of the roll-out work for Deaf Sport Reform.



Yet once again a further meeting with IOC will be imminent in the next coming months as ICSD will need to implement a number of new and exciting proposals as mark of new beginning and changes for our organisation.

Things are now moving ahead with regard to the Deaf Sport Reform as steps are being taken place to set up to follow framework and timeline which will see ICSD becoming structured, lean, effective, focused with vibrant, revised constitution, bylaws and regulations to include all three of DSR's disciples – Deaflympics, World Sport and Youth.

ICSD wants to use long term strategy in establishing a unique partnership between the Deaf Sport Reform and the respective governments of the world. This proposed partnership should serve as a force multiplier, permitting the combination and complementing of deaf sports' and governments' respective resources and assets, and results in a coordinated and cohesive approach to equality and diversity in sport.

We are now in the process of selecting Deaf Sport Reform working committees; a collective workshop meeting will take place sometime this year and once they are being set up a regular bulletin will then be issued in the website so as to keep us abreast of its progressive developments to come.

A few things from the Deaflympics front:

- Urgent steps have already been taken to embark on stringent actions needed following the site inspection visit last January of 2011 Winter Deaflympics in Vysoké Tatry, Slovakia.
- I shall be visiting Vancouver in March 2010 to meet 2015 Winter Deaflympics Organising Committee whilst being a VIP guest of Winter Paralympic Games.
- Following recent visit by Executive Director (now renamed as Chief Executive as part of new strategic direction) in November 2009, a further visit is planned to Athens this year for an update on their progress for 2013 Summer Deaflympics

As I sign off this message we are on an important mission, but we cannot get there without the dedicated support and collaboration of all ICSD members and stakeholders with confidence, enthusiasm, hard work to remain and we must simply start to embrace and inspire the new pathways in Deaf Sport Reform by following the principles and values of Deaflympics, World Sport and Youth.

ICSD Summer Technical Directors for the term of 2010 – 2013

After 2009 Summer Deaflympics in Chinese Taipei, all former Summer Technical Directors are ready to work. They have worked very hard and very good. A very big thank you to all the Summer TDs!

ICSD will be selecting 17 Summer TDs for the term 2010 – 2013. Announcement will be made in this [ENEWS edition](#) of the new selected TDs

Two TDs will have 2 following responsibilities: That is Cycling Road/Mountain Bike and Wrestling Freestyle/Wrestling Greco-Roman.

In the past, Beach Volleyball and Volleyball had one TD who was responsible for both kinds of sports. For the term 2010 – 2013, both kind of sports will have their own Technical Directors.

Assistant Technical Director will be appointed, based on the minimum required number of athletes in each sport when we review the preliminary entry forms received for 2013 Summer Deaflympics and for World Championship.

To ensure ICSD receives the best candidates, we no longer require recommendation from National Deaf Sports Federation (NDSF). Therefore, NDSF will be

no longer be expected to pay for the Technical Director's travel.

There are still some vacant positions like Cycling/Mountain bike, Karate and Volleyball, we are still looking for highly qualified candidates.

We hope that all persons with interest for these positions as a Technical Director will inform us as soon as possible.

We, the ICSD, can confirm that every Technical Director will be comfortable with us and that the cooperation will be as profound as in Taipei, when the Summer Deaflympics were carried out.

World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA)

The WADA is an indispensable institution for every kind of sport and for every Deaf sporting event. This means that ICSD has to keep in touch and in good cooperation with WADA.

This is the reason why I urgently demand every Deaf Sport Federation to investigate eagerly the website of WADA where one will find the new and latest expressions which are of great importance for ICSD. Please be deeply aware of these expressions such as ADAMS, International Registered Testing Pool (IRTP), TUE, National Anti-Doping Organisation (NADO) etc.

From now on, only those Deaf Sport Federations are allowed to be members of ICSD which are regularly in contact with the WADA/ NADO. Otherwise those countries which don't follow the WADA/ NADO, cannot participate at Deaf Sport Events. It is a fact that the developing countries will have difficulties to fulfill the rules which are presented by WADA/ NADO. However, I urge every country to keep up with the development Without WADA/ NADO there will be NO Deaf Sport!

ICSD Audiogram

Without having an ICSD – Audiogram, an athlete is not allowed to participate in Deaf

Sport Events. This Audiogram is an obligation for every athlete which is like a passport to enable the participation. So I demand every Deaf Sport Federation to examine the Audiogram regulation in the ICSD's [website](#) accurately.

Let's go for a good cooperation and best wishes for 2010!

Report from Vice President - Youth Sports

Recently we returned from Slovakia where the Board met and decided on several issues.

As the Chair of **Athletes Commission** we had decided to elect several deaf athletes to become the members of the Athletes Commission. Their duty is as follows:

- To collect suggestions from other athletes
- To discover the athletes problems that the management may not know
- To collect athletes requirements with regard to the Deaflympics
- To raise new ideas to improve the athletes status.

There may be several more issues that we may have overlooked and the Athletes Commission will help us to solve the unseen problems and the Board will be too happy to take care for their suggestions. The letters will be sent shortly to first five National Deaf Sports Federations for their approval of their respective athletes.

Deaf Youth Sports is being under review and has been started building and collecting information and hopefully we will approach several various bodies to get it under way.

Under Deaf Sports Reform, Deaf Youth Sports is one of three main sections (Deaflympics and World Deaf Sports are other two sections under respective President and Vice President) and we are very much committed to this movement to break through to advancement and growth of the Deaf Sports including the deaf youth. Nowadays more and more various government and other bodies recognize that youth sports is very much essential for health purpose therefore Deaflympics also sees that this project of youth deaf sports is one of the highest priorities for all deaf.

Any suggestion or question will be with great pleasure accepted and your co-operation is highly appreciated.

Alpine Skiing

From 23.01. - 25.01 I was in Slovakia for 2011 Winter Deaflympics site inspection. I've looked at 2 different mountains.

First visit was in Strbske Pleso near Vysoké Tatry and this mountain was not bad. I thought this mountain was ideal for tourist, not for elite athletes.



The second visit was in Jansa, I liked it very much and I have received from the Chief Mountain the homologation certificate. The designed course is FIS recognized. The other reason why I really like this course is because skiers can go down only once with one run. The last time was in Banff / Canada when Downhill Course have 1 run. That will certainly be a challenge for athletes. The Ski club in Jansa work very well and are professional. The OC has agreed to move all races to Jasna.

Cross Country Skiing

I went to the site inspection visit at Vysoké Tatry in Slovakia. The cross country skiing area will be in Strbske Pleso area, the Ski stadium area will be at the Olympic Center, and the Opening and Closing ceremony will be there too. The scenery is beautiful and the terrain is challenging for the skiers! The official ski trail map and profile was not provided to me yet. The Olympic Stadium is located at 1355m altitude. In the competition area they will provide a ski wax cabin service to every country team. This is the same area where Strbske Pleso hosted Junior World Championships in 2009 and FIS Ski Jumping World Cup back in the 1980's.

For women, the two events have been cancelled due to less than 5 countries rule. Those events are 3x5km

relay and team sprint. Men will have 5 events and women will have 3 events. Age restriction is for longer distance, remember to check the different age limit for young skiers. Please check [here](#) for Age

Eligibility. Similarly, the team outfit should be only max 400cm2, please see regulation of the Deaflympics.

The final registrations with the names of each athlete indicating event entered must be submitted to the Secretariat no later than **04 February 2011**. Around August 2010 you will know more about the competition and training schedule.

I hope that the tournament will be about fair play and it will determine who wins. We are looking forward to meet you soon, one year is a short time!

IOC Executive Board approves qualification systems for the 1st Winter Youth Olympic Games in 2012 in Innsbruck

IOC Press Release - 10 December 2009

The Executive Board (EB) of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) today approved the qualification system for each event at the first Winter Youth Olympic Games (YOG), which will be held in Innsbruck in 2012. This follows the previous EB approval of the sports competition programme.

The qualification system for each sport and discipline, which was prepared in close collaboration with the International Federations (IF), strives to guarantee participation of the best athletes in their age category.

For all disciplines, competitions such as Junior World Championships and Continental Championships, or official junior ranking lists, will allow athletes to attempt to qualify for the YOG.

Over 1,000 athletes will compete in Innsbruck in seven sports, comprising 63 events. The number of sports on the programme is identical to the Vancouver programme. Each event has its own age group* competing, either 15-16, 16-17 or 17-18 years old. The bobsleigh age group will be 18-19 years old, and male participants in the pairs and ice

dancing skating events will be 15-18 years old, to comply with the specificities of the sport.

The Youth Olympic Games will see some events differ from those of the Olympic Games. A hockey skills challenge and women's ski jumping will be included. Mixed-gender and mixed-NOC team events will take place in biathlon, curling (artificial track), skating (figure skating, short track speed skating and speed skating with mass start), and skiing (Alpine skiing and ski jumping). The combination of cross country skiing and biathlon will be organised as a mixed-gender team event.

Besides the sports competition programme, the YOG will feature an extensive Culture and Education Programme (CEP), which aims to introduce young athletes to Olympism and the Olympic values, and to raise awareness on important issues such as the benefits of a healthy lifestyle, the fight against doping and their role as sports ambassadors in their communities.

The Executive Board discussed the general progress of preparations by IYOGOC for the YOG, which are on time and moving ahead steadily.

* The age being the athlete's age on 31 December in the year of the YOG.
